IMPORTANT INFORMATION - PLEASE KEEP

Trip dates: January: 11, 12, 18, 25, 26 February: 1, 2, 8, 9, 22, 23

Non-bus family night: (provide your own transportation) **January 19, February 15** (Purchase tickets 5:30-7:00 pm from Mike & Sue at Mt. Brighton)

- **DEPARTURE:** *Friday 5:00pm /Saturday 4:30pm* @ Salem High School student parking lot (46181 Joy Road, Canton)
- **RETURN:** 11:15 p.m. @ Salem Student Parking Lot **Parents: Please be on time for pick-up. Students may NOT walk home!!**

NOTE: All skiers should report 15 minutes before departure time. **NO SKI I.D., NO TRIP!!** You must bring your I.D. in order to board the bus.

READ CAREFULLY! Please read and sign the **Code of Conduct Form**. It is required for participation and rules will be strictly enforced. **Should an injury or major rules violation occur during the trip, an emergency contact must be available.**

EQUIPMENT PROTECTION AND SECURITY: All equipment must be transported in **travel bags**, clearly marked, to avoid mix-ups. This will also secure your equipment while being transported to and from Mt. Brighton. **Only 1 pair of skis or 1 snowboard per bag!** The Ski Program is **NOT** responsible for missing or damaged ski or snowboard equipment **before, during and/or after each trip**

TRIP CANCELLATION INFORMATION: If the weather is questionable, call **Mt Brighton: 810-229-9581** for up-to-date information. If no recording, report to the Salem High School parking lot close to departure time for latest information. For snow and weather conditions, call **Mt Brighton: 810-229-9581**. **If school is cancelled during the day, program will NOT run. Get REMIND for up to date cancellation information [HERE](#)**

BUS REGULATIONS: School district bus rules must be followed.

- **EVERY STUDENT MUST BE ON THE BUS FOR THE RETURN TRIP BY 10:05 P.M.** Tardiness will result in program suspension.
- Transportation is round-trip only! You must go on the same bus to and from Mt. Brighton. **No one-way rides.**

LIFT TICKETS:

Our club receives special pricing from Mt. Brighton that is not available to any other organization!

- Lessons are encouraged and not required. Lessons are only \$10 per lesson and are available both nights. They are provided by National Ski Association certified instructors employed by Epic Resorts.
- All tickets are **\$30.00.** These tickets are the same price for us **both** nights. All tickets must be purchased from Mike or Sue Gottschalk **only. Our rates are not available at ticket windows.**
- Club tickets will be sold on the bus enroute to Mt. Brighton. Club tickets sold on the buses will be exchanged for actual tickets as students exit the buses. **PLEASE BRING CORRECT CHANGE IN ORDER TO PURCHASE TICKETS ON THE BUS. BRING \$10.00 EXTRA FOR LESSONS EACH NIGHT.**
- You may provide your own transportation (**to and from...no one ways allowed**) and purchase discount tickets from the P-CCS coordinators, on site, not at ticket windows. Tickets are available at Mt. Brighton at our program rates from Mike & Sue **only.** We will be available **after** all students from buses are safely into Mt. Brighton.
- **No P-CCS program discount tickets will be sold after 7:00 p.m. as Mt. Brighton now closes at 10:00 pm.**

SKI and SNOWBOARD RENTAL PROCEDURES: **SKIS or SNOWBOARDS: \$15.00 each. No special discount for snowboard only.**

- Students needing rentals will receive their rental form on the bus. At Mt. Brighton, you will follow instructions to get to the "rentals" line. Mike will be available in that area upon arrival at Mt. Brighton.
- **Helmets are required. Rentals are \$4.00**

NEW PROCEDURE: We no longer require students to be certified to allow access to the different areas of the mountain.

SKI PATROL: Mt. Brighton runs a top National Ski Patrol Program with respect to injury procedures. They provide a level of care far superior to most areas in the nation. This is one of the main reasons why we go to Mt. Brighton. All head injuries require release by EMT's which are routinely called by the ski area. Parents are immediately contacted upon any injury, and follow up is provided by coordinators.

SKIER RESPONSIBILITY: If students ski out of control on any hill, their ticket will be reviewed and possibly revoked.
